Installing/Removing the Antenna





Screw the antenna into the connector on the top of the transceiver by holding the antenna at its base and turning it clockwise until secure. Turn the antenna counter–clockwise to remove it.

Note:

The antenna is neither an handle, a key ring retainer, nor a speaker/microphone attachment point. Using the antenna in these ways may damage the antenna and degrade your transceiver's performance.

Installing/Removing the Battery





Match the top of the battery pack with the corresponding proves on the radio. Push the battery onto the bottom of the radio, buckle the safety lock. To remove the battery pack, life the safety lock and pull the battery pack away from the radio.

Installing the Belt Clip: Align the belt clip with the slot on the back of the battery and insert.

Installing accessories: Remove accessories jack cover, plug into the speaker/microphone/ programming cable into the jack.

Battery charging



Use the matching desktop charger to charge the battery/battery-equipped transceiver. Make sure that the battery is in contact with the charger contact. When the charging indicator light is red, charging starts, and when the green light is on, charging is complete.

Note: When charging the transceiver, it is recommended to turn it off.

Basic Operation

Powering On/Off

Turn the Power/Volume Knob clockwise until a click sounds to switch on the transceiver.

To switch off the transceiver, turn counter-clockwise until a click sounds.

Adjusting the Volume

Rotate the Power/Volume Knob to adjust the volume. Turn clockwise to increase the volume and counter-clockwise to decrease the volume.

Push To Talk

To make a call, press and hold the PTT switch, then speak into the microphone using your normal speaking voice. Release PTT switch to receive.

Care and Cleaning

To guarantee optimal performance as well as a long service life of the product, please follow the tips below.

- Do not puncture or scratch the product with hard objects.
- Do not place the product in corrosive agents, solutions or water.
- Do not handle the radio by its antenna or external microphone directly.
- When not in use, keep the accessory jacks covered with the protective caps.



Power off the product, and remove the battery before cleaning.

- Clean up the dust and fine particles on the product parts with a clean and dry lint-free cloth or a brush regularly.
- Use a non-woven fabric with neutral cleanser to clean the keys, control knobs, and shell after long-time use. Do not use chemical preparations such as stain removers, alcohol, sprays or oil preparations.
- Make sure the product is completely dry before use.
